WHAT IS VISION ZERO SOUTH WEST?

Vision Zero South West is a partnership combining every authority in Devon and Cornwall with an interest or stake in road safety. All members share a commitment to cut the number of deaths and serious injuries by 50% by 2030 – and eventually to zero.

































The partnership is led by a board which includes a wide range of experts from across the South West, including senior police and fire officers, leading clinicians, councillors, and the Police and Crime commissioner for Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

HOW ARE WE FUNDED?

Vision Zero South West is funded by the surplus costs recovered by Devon & Cornwall Police from offending motorists through driver training schemes and costs awarded by Magistrates Courts, once police operating costs are met.

Devon & Cornwall Police recovers administration costs following referral to UKROEd National Driver Offender Retraining Scheme (NDORS) courses – and under the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act 2022, provides a source of funding to VZSW's road safety delivery plans, which aim to deliver innovative and effective road safety projects to reduce the risk of harm and educate road users.

WHAT DO WE DO?

As previously mentioned, Vision Zero South West is focussed on reducing the number of people killed or seriously injured on Devon and Cornwall's roads. The partnership funds a wide variety of projects or campaigns which share this aim through a number of different platforms, including a grant funding programme open to members of the public.

IN JUNE '24 THE NUMBER OF INCIDENTS IN **CSW AREAS** REDUCED FROM THE **PREVIOUS MONTH** TO 2,231

66 % agreed that CSW is a useful way of tackling speed.

59 % agreed that CSW teams do a good job of keeping communities safe.

> 70 % agreed that **CSW** activity in the future would make them drive slower.

72 % agreed that the warning letter made them want to change their driving.

MOST RECENT AVAILABLE RESULTS, JUNE 2024

- New submissions were received for the Devon and Cornwall Police to consider.
- 44% of June's submissions are subject of positive action.
- Generated Prosecution notifications and requirements to identify the driver and 45 generated advice.
- 215) 32% of June's submissions were from cyclists.
- 95 44% of the reports from cyclists have received positive action.
- 6/9 Reports from horse riders in June were subject of action.

A proportion of the incidents that were not progressed were for incidents that are not suitable for SNAP. These included poor parking.
